Top Storylines:

 **USI starts year ranked 12th.** The University of Southern Indiana was ranked 12th in the NABC/Division II Top 25 and 13th in the *Division II Bulletin* Top 25 preseason polls. The preseason rankings were the first for the Screaming Eagles since the 2008-09 season.

 **Eagles picked third in GLVC East.** The GLVC head coaches are predicting that USI will finish third in the conference's East Division. The GLVC East includes preseason top-ranked and defending NCAA II national champion Bellarmine University, Kentucky Wesleyan College, University of Indianapolis, Lewis University, Northern Kentucky, Saint Joseph's College, USI, and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

 **USI looks to replace points and rebounds.** The 2011-12 Eagles need to replace nine players and 76 percent of the last season's offense and 65 percent of last year's rebounding.

 **Watson closes on 50 wins.** USI Head Coach Rodney Watson, who is 48-9 in two seasons with the Eagles, needs two victories in the first four USI regular season games to tie Bruce Pearl as the fastest Eagles' coach to 50 wins.

 **Top returning scorer.** Senior guard Brandon Hogg is USI's top returning scorer with 11.1 points in 2010-11. Hogg was named to the GLVC All-Tournament team after averaging 16.0 points and six assists in the three contests. He also tied a career-best with 25 points and eight assists against Drury University in the semifinals.

 **Eagles in 2010-11.** The Eagles finished the 2010-11 campaign with a 24-6 overall record; was 14-4 in the GLVC; placed second in the GLVC East Division; were second at the GLVC Tournament; earned a berth in the NCAA Division II Tournament; and were ranked 12th in the final NABC/Division II Top 25.

USI Exhibition Notes



USI vs. Division I in exhibition season. The Eagles are 0-9 in exhibition games against Division I teams since 2003. USI has been edging closer against its Division I preseason opponents – the University of Evansville, University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, University of Tennessee, University of Louisville, University of Cincinnati, Southern Illinois University, University of Illinois, and Vanderbilt University – but still is being outscored by an average of 80.9-68.6.



Second year versus the Big Ten. With its visit Purdue University, USI has played a Big Ten opponent in an exhibition game two years in a row. The Eagles had the University of Illinois on the ropes last year, after erasing a 13-point first half deficit, but lost a nine-point decision to the Illini, 76-67, in Champaign, Illinois.



In the 2010-11 preseason. Senior guard Brandon Hogg, who had 10 points in the close game with the University of Illinois last year, averaged 6.5 points, 5.0 rebounds, 1.5 assists, and 1.5 steals in USI's preseason games with Illinois and Vanderbilt University.

USI's GLVC Season Notes:



USI vs. GLVC since 1992-93. The Eagles have been dominating in the GLVC since 1992-93, posting a regular season conference record of 288-75 (.793). Between 1992 and 2011, USI has had at least 14 wins 19 times, posted 16 or more wins eight times, and won seven regular season conference titles.



Against the East Division. The Eagles were 4-5 against the GLVC East Division in 2010-11.



Against the GLVC North. USI was 5-0 against the GLVC North Division last year.



Against the GLVC West. USI was 7-0 against the GLVC West Division last year.

USI Season Notes:



USI reached the 20-win plateau. The Eagles have surpassed the 20-win mark 19 times in 21 seasons. The 20-win plateau is usually the first step toward earning a spot in the NCAA Division II Tournament.



At home in 2010-11. USI was 14-2 at home last year and was led by center Mohamed Ntumba with 14.6 points per game. Guard C.J. Trotter and guard Brandon Hogg followed with 12.6 and 10.6 points per outing. Ntumba and forward Isaac McClure also were one-two in rebounding with 8.7 and 6.6 per game.



Away from the PAC in 2010-11. The Eagles were 10-4 away from the PAC and led by guard C.J. Trotter with 17.3 points per game. Center Mohamed Ntumba recorded 13.9 points and 8.0 rebounds per contest, while guard Brandon Hogg is scoring 11.3 points per appearance.



Eagle over .500 against ranked teams. USI was 3-3 against ranked teams last year, 46-39 (.541) since 1992-93.



USI tops century mark twice in 2010-11. The Screaming Eagles topped the century mark twice last season. The Eagles are 116-3 (.975) when it scores 100 or more points and 12-3 (.800) when both teams score 100 or more since 1992-93. USI has won the last 59 games when it has posted 100 or more points.



Home-Sweet-Home. USI is 263-25 (.913) at home since 1992-93 when playing at the PAC.



The magic number is 70. USI is 248-44 (.849) when scoring 70 points or more in a game since 1999-2000. The Eagles are just 20-34 (.370) when scoring less than 70 during the last 10 years.

Rodney Watson

Men's Basketball Head Coach

Rodney Watson, the ninth head coach in the history of the USI men's basketball team, has had the Screaming Eagles soaring during his two seasons. Watson is 48-9 (.842) overall during his two years, including a 29-7 GLVC record.

The 2010-11 season saw Watson lead the Eagles to a 24-6 overall mark and a second place finish in the GLVC East Division with a 14-4 performance. USI also placed second in the GLVC Tournament and returned to the NCAA Division II Tournament under Watson guidance in 2010-11.

The 2010 GLVC Coach of the Year led USI to a 24-3 overall mark and ninth-place finish in the national poll during his first season. The Eagles set a school-record with 23-straight wins and were ranked as high as second in the national ranking.

The 24 wins were the most by a first-year USI head coach. The 2009-10 squad also featured *Basketball Times* Division II Player of the Year and All-American Jamar Smith.

Watson took the helm of the Eagles after 21 seasons at Southern Illinois University. He was the associate head coach during his last two seasons after spending 19 seasons as an assistant coach under head coaches Rich Herrin, Bruce Weber, Matt Painter, and Chris Lowery.

During Watson's tenure at SIU, the Salukis won 11 Missouri Valley Conference championships and qualified for nine NCAA Tournaments and six NITs. SIU also compiled a 430-237 record, a .645 winning percentage, and was ranked in the top 15 nationally in scoring defense four times in the last five seasons.

Watson helped direct five Salukis to MVC Player of the Year honors; four to Newcomer of the Year awards; five to Freshman of the Year accolades; and nine to Defensive Player of the Year honors. The Salukis had 30 players earn All-MVC honors (18 first team and 12 second) during Watson's 21 seasons.

The Salukis' success was not limited to the basketball court, with 23 of the last 24 seniors earning bachelor's degrees since 2002. SIU had the Prairie Farms Student Athlete of the Year for men's basketball three times since the award was created in 2002.

A native of Paris, Illinois, Watson started his coaching career at Coulterville High School, where he guided the Eagles to the program's first regional championship. He moved to Madison High School in 1984 and led the Trojans to a regional and sectional championship, advancing to the Illinois Elite Eight.

Success at the high school level was a springboard to the college ranks, beginning with a two-year stretch in 1986 at the University of Nebraska-Omaha. He moved to SIU in 1988, beginning his 21-year association with the Salukis.

Watson and his wife Carol have four children, Ashley, Zachary, and twins, Olivia and Blake.

Derrick Tilmon **Assistant Men's Basketball Coach**

Derrick Tilmon begins his third season as an assistant men's basketball coach at the University of Southern Indiana and as a part of Head Coach **Rodney Watson's** staff.

Tilmon started his collegiate career as a player at Hiawassee Junior College (Madisonville, Tennessee) before playing three seasons at Southern Illinois University. He was a three-year starting forward and center for the Salukis, ending his career as SIU's 13th all-time leading shot blocker. The Salukis were 20-13 and advanced to the second round of the NIT during Tilmon's senior season.

After his playing days at SIU, Tilmon spent five years playing professionally in Europe. He earned a spot on the Netherlands All-Star team and was part of the Netherlands championship series.

Tilmon entered the coaching ranks after his playing days, spending a year at Shorter College (Rome, Georgia) before moving onto Kentucky Wesleyan College (Owensboro, Kentucky), where he spent the previous three seasons.

Tilmon, who graduated from SIU with a bachelor's degree in health education in 2000, and his wife Nicole, have a son, Derrick, Jr.

Brent Owen enters his third year as an assistant coach after making the transition from player to coach in 2009-10.
